Seating on stage is limited to 100 faculty. Once we reach capacity, the RSVP form will close, and we won't be able to accommodate additional faculty who haven't RSVP'd in advance. Please RSVP early if you plan to participate.

Guest tickets will not be available for faculty this year due to venue constraints.
